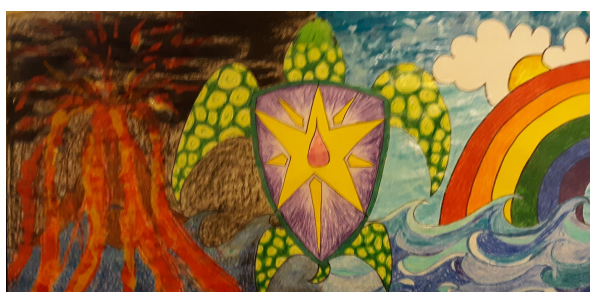

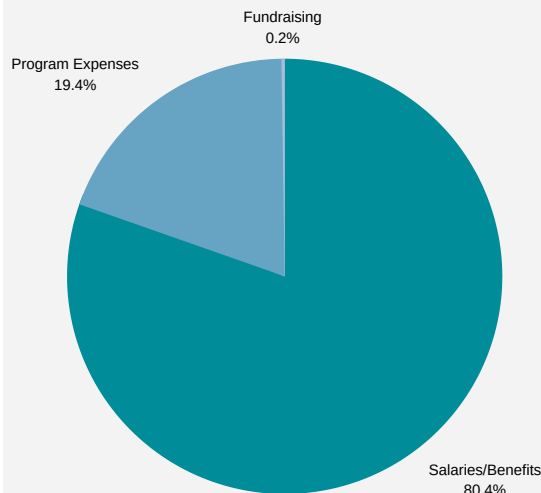

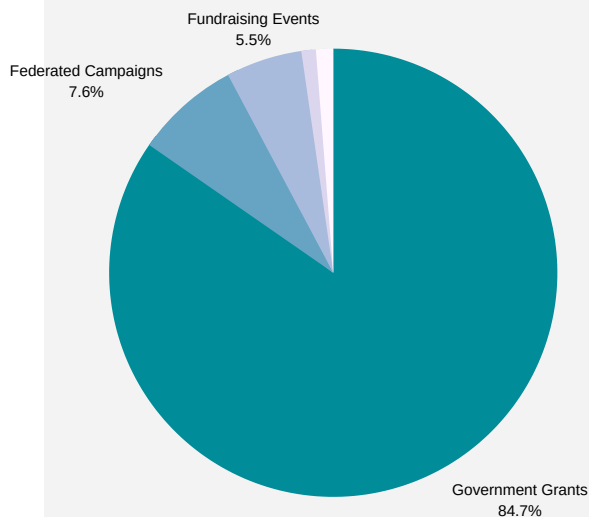
This past fiscal year was a challenging one, but SARCC rose to the occasion and provided consistent and quality healing services and prevention programs throughout the COVID-19 Pandemic. In the spring, we quickly adapted services to be able to provide telehealth support, and also continued our in-person crisis response, accompaniment, and support services.

Through this challenging year, survivors showed bravery and courage by accessing healing support. Our staff and volunteers provided support for 916 children and adults, and offered 625 educational programs to over 17,000 individuals in Lebanon & Schuylkill Counties. Our therapy services expanded, and the organization can now offer no-cost Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) Therapy in both counties.

We are grateful to the donors, sponsors, and supporters who have made this work possible once again this year. Thank you for being a part of this powerful work at SARCC!

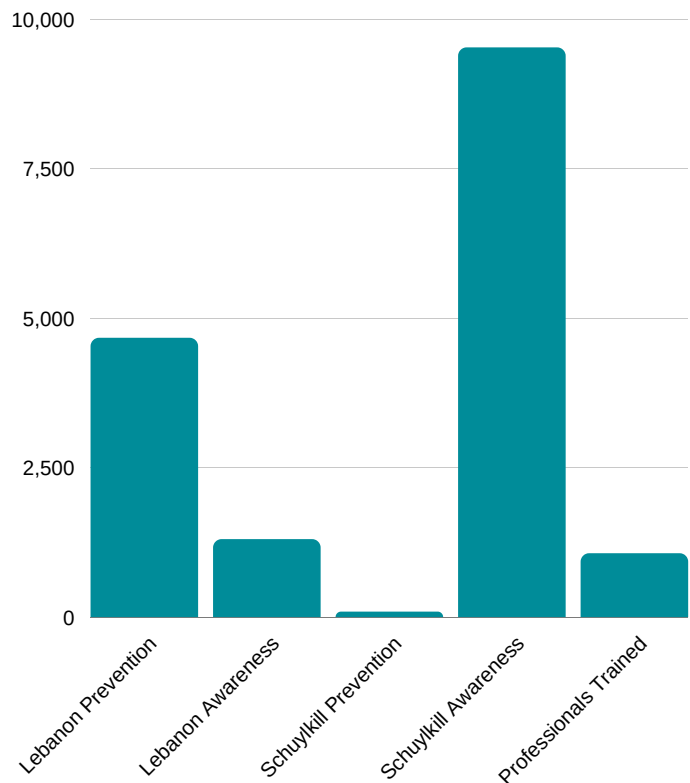

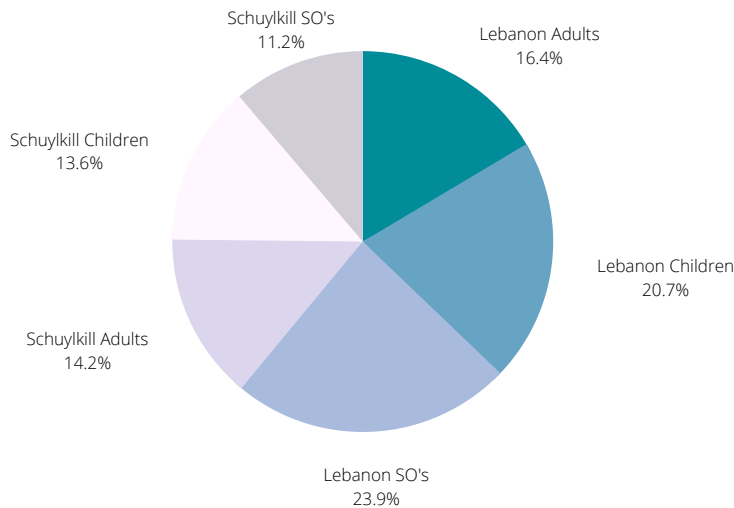
Every parent in our PITK program reported that the program was useful and worth their time.

SARCC continues to make the shift from educating our community on being aware of sexual violence, to building the skills of our community to PREVENT the first time perpetration of sexual violence. Stopping this violence before it starts in the primary goal, and is possible through a combination of skill building, policy advocacy, and intentional shifts in attitudes about sexual violence victimization and perpetration. Last year, we trained 17,457 community members.

PROMOTING HEALING

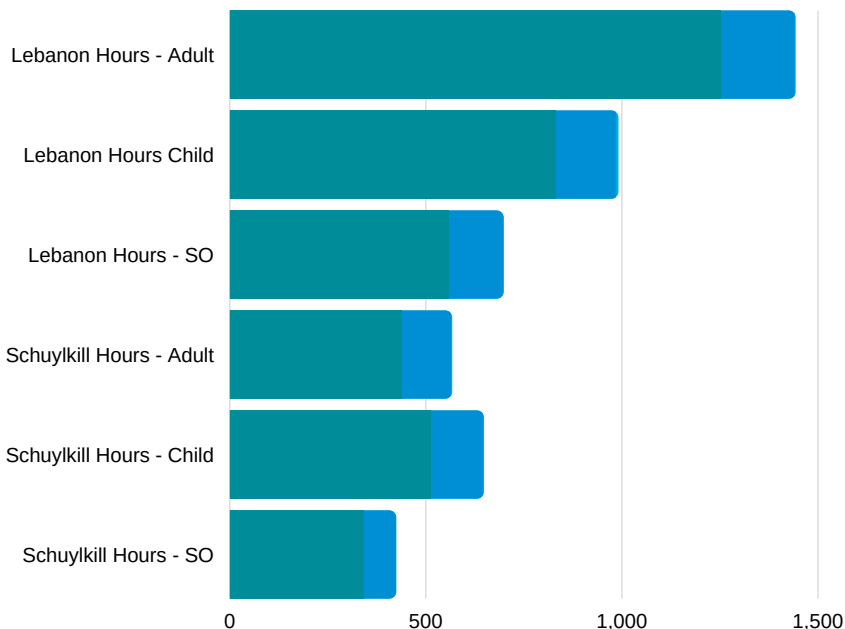


CLIENTS SERVED

SARCC provided crisis counseling, hotline support, therapy, advocacy, and accompaniment to 916 children, adults, and significant others in our communities. Services take place in our offices, at schools, at the Children's Resource Center, in the communities, at prisons, and treatment facilities.

HOURS SERVED

Overall, SARCC staff and volunteers provided 4,765 hours of direct service support during the year - an increase of over the prior year despite fewer new clients. The hours shown to the left are broken down by female, male, and transgender clients receiving counseling services. Counseling and therapy services are delivered through both individual and group settings depending on the needs of the client.
