
#### Micah's House - Advocacy

#### **Long Term Vision:**

By the end of this project, we will have five permanent supported housing options. Each will be named after a SARCC Core Value. **We need your help!** Help us find and secure properties, and suggest naming honors for our next three homes:



**Safety House:** SARCC's SAFETY value guides us as we help people find safe space for healing, whether at SARCC or in their homes, schools, or communities.

**Social Transformation House:** People who perpetrate sexual violence do not discriminate. SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION House will help make our systems, neighborhoods, and communities safer for all people.

# **Invest in Survivors**

#### STATE AND FEDERAL FUNDING CUTS THREATEN LOCAL SERVICES

Despite the staggering prevalence and lifetime impacts of sexual violence, Pennsylvania is effectively cutting funding to rape crisis centers. Specifically, SARCC experienced a \$89,727 reduction (a 28% cut in buying power from PA). When we put that next to the \$113,321 cut in federal VOCA dollars (47% cut) and the temporary federal assistance funding we received during the past three years due to COVID relief, **SARCC is facing a deficit of \$212,720 (or 34% of our operating budget).** Our local program has cut 9 positions since these cuts began.

Advocates from across the state dedicated hours of time, miles of driving, and tons of foot traffic at the PA State Capitol, Human Services Roundtables, and meeting with elected officials in district offices.








Sexual Assault Programs surviving 5 years of funding cuts seek change for survivors.

# Why support SARCC?

Last year, SARCC gratefully received \$186,897 in charitable giving and accepted 2,425 hours of volunteer services valued at \$78,296. We are careful stewards of the charitable donations and local, state, federal, and foundation grants received. 94.2 cents of fundraised every dollar goes directly back into services.

### What does your support provide?

**\$20** = 1 hour hotline counseling

**\$60** = 1 hour of advocacy support

**\$125** = 1 hour of Trauma therapy

**\$250** = 1 hour of support group

**\$500** = Trial Accompaniment for a family

**\$1500** = 10 session prevention program

\$2500 = A week of summer camp

\$5000 = One month of supported housing

# New programs for kids & caregivers



## **Introducing Project Safe & Smart**

SARCC prevention team members partnered with PCCD to introduce Project Safe & Smart. This evidence-based prevention program combines a single-session puppet-themed prevention program for Pre-k through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade with a parenting workshop designed to help parents quickly learn how to spot grooming behaviors and build safer environments for their kids. This two-year project brings new tools to our prevention team and will roll out to school districts in Fall 2025.

## **Prevention Program Impacts**

- Provided **385** Primary Prevention Programs to **1,579** Lebanon & Schuylkill Co. residents.
- Presented 425 Educational workshops to 14,681 Lebanon & Schuylkill Co. residents.
- Offered 25 trainings to 385 local professionals.

#### **Criminal and Civil Protections**

SARCC advocates support survivors through police reporting, trials, filing protection orders, and accessing victim's compensation. No one chooses this experience, but they do have rights and choices in their justice and healing.

## **Support at Forensic Interviews**

Our advocates provide support to both children and families referred for forensic interviews at the Child Advocacy Center. We also offer follow-up prevention education counseling and help families navigate services and systems.

## **Crisis Counseling & Support Groups**

Some survivors seek to connect with a counselor or other survivors to make sense of the healing process. We provide short-term counseling, groups for survivors and parents of child survivors, and groups for specific populations (LGBTQ+, men/women's groups, teens), and in targeted settings (i.e. school districts, colleges, treatment facilities, prisons).
